Exhibits are one of the things that make Fairs different than Festivals.

This book is filled with different items that can be entered in the Florence County Fair. Our goal is to get as many exhibits as possible from people throughout Florence County, but there are some Special Contests that can be entered by people even if they are outside of Florence County.

If you are unsure how to enter, we are more than happy to help you with it!

### **How to Enter Exhibits:**

- ◆ Registration is FREE.
- ◆ Registration Dates: If you have questions, you can call the fair at 906-282-9153 or email [florencecountyfair@hotmail.com](mailto:florencecountyfair@hotmail.com)
  - ◆ Pre-Registration is until August 9.
  - ◆ Entries will be accepted after August 9, but it is requested that after August 9, you email your entries or bring your entry form with you to the fair on August 21. All items must be registered and brought to the fair by August 21.
- ◆ Please note: It is easier and quicker for you to preregister all of the items you think you might be bringing and then cancel those items that weren't ready when you drop off your items.
- ◆ Those pre-registered will have their entry tags printed and waiting for them when they come to drop off their exhibits.
- ◆ Pre-registered exhibitors may still add or remove items from their registration form when they bring their items to the fair.
- ◆ Please schedule a time to drop off your items on August 21. Due to current social distancing guidelines, only 2-3 exhibitors will be allowed in the building to drop off items at one time. You will need to sign-up for a drop-off time between noon and 6 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21. If you preregister, you can indicate your time preference on the form. If you do not preregister, you will need to call or e-mail to setup an appointment to drop off your items.

- ◆ Exhibits cannot be released before 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Exhibits may be picked up between 4 and 6 p.m. on Sunday, August 25. You will be able to sign-up for a pick-up time when you drop off your exhibits. If this day and time does not work for picking up exhibits, please let us know when you bring your exhibits on Wednesday.
- ◆ There is a registration form on page 2. You may make copies or write on a blank sheet of paper. The same entry form can be used for kids (youth class), adults (open class) and special contest entries. Each individual must have their own form.

### **2024 Special Exhibit Contests (Open to all ages inside and outside of Florence County)**

Blue Ribbon Artist Contest\*, Blue Ribbon Apple Pie Contest^, Chocolate Chip Cookie Championship^, Coloring Contest\*, Loop It—Loop Yarn Contest\*, Recycling Art Contest\*, Taylor Swift Inspired "Swiftie" Contest\*, Trail Cam Contest (no age group this contest only)

- ◆ These Special Exhibit Contests are open to Florence County Residents as well as those outside of Florence County. These are different than traditional exhibits entered in the fair. There are no charges for entering these contests. No preregistration is required.
- ◆ Only one entry per exhibitor per category. The item must be the sole and original work of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor may enter one of each of the coloring contests. Only entries that have not been previously entered into these contests will be permitted.
- ◆ All Local Rules and Regulations apply to Special Contests unless specifically noted.
- ◆ Age Groups and Prize Money are different:

Contests Marked with a \* will be awarded prizes with 5 age groups based on the age group/skill level as follows:

Age Group C .....	5-6 years old .....	1st—\$1.50; 2nd—\$1.00; 3rd—\$0.50
Age Group X .....	7-8 years old .....	1st—\$3.00; 2nd—\$2.00; 3rd—\$1.00
Age Group Y .....	9-12 years old .....	1st—\$4.00; 2nd—\$2.00; 3rd—\$1.00
Age Group Z .....	13-17 years old .....	1st—\$5.00; 2nd—\$2.50; 3rd—\$1.00
Age Group O .....	18 years & older .....	1st—\$7.00; 2nd—\$3.50; 3rd—\$2.00

Contests Marked with a ^ 2 age groups based on the age group/skill level as follows:

### **Florence County Fair Local Regulations for Youth Class 2024:**

1. All Florence County residents are eligible to exhibit at the Fair. All Florence County residents over the age of 18 may enter in Open Class. All Florence County youth, may enter Youth Class exhibits in the fair. Youth Class is defined as:
  - Children under the age of 5, can only enter exhibits listed in Department 17a.
  - Children ages 5-6 may only enter exhibits listed in Department 17 Classes B through H.
  - Any child having completed first grade, through grade 12, may enter the rest of the exhibits Departments 1-16 and 18-34.
2. Additional entry forms are available online at [www.florencecountyfair.com](http://www.florencecountyfair.com).
3. Items should be made with a good clean wholesome nature—no vulgar or suggestive decorations will be allowed.
4. All exhibits shall remain on display for the duration of the fair.
5. Exhibit release is 4:00 p.m. Sunday. Removal of any or all exhibits before 4:00 p.m. Sunday will result in forfeiture of all premiums, as per Wisconsin State Regulations.
6. All exhibits at the fairgrounds are under the supervision of the Florence County Agricultural Society. Reasonable care will be taken to protect against loss, injury, or damage to exhibits; however, the exhibitor exhibits at his/her own risk.
7. Exhibits must be the work/craftsmanship of the exhibitor. Only exhibits not shown previously at the Florence County Fair may be entered this year. If an exhibit has won a premium at a different Wisconsin Fair, you will need to indicate that by the specific entry on your entry form.
8. Youth Class Exhibits are judged under the Danish Judging System and Special Contest Exhibits are judged under the Single Placing System.
9. State-registered judges are carefully selected: exhibitors agree to abide by the judges' decisions.
10. An exhibitor may enter only one item in each lot.
11. Violation of any Florence County Fair regulation shall result in forfeiture of premiums, and may result in being excluded from further competition.
12. Further rules and requirements may be found under each department. Although these local regulations are only listed on this page, they apply to all of the Youth Class Exhibits.
13. There are additional rules and regulations for the Special Contest Exhibits, which can be found at the back of this book.

### **Florence County Fair Local Regulations for Open Class 2024:**

1. All Florence County residents are eligible to exhibit at the Fair. All Florence County residents over the age of 18 may enter in Open Class. All Florence County youth, may enter Youth Class exhibits in the fair. See Youth Class portion of the fair book for information on ages, categories, etc.
2. Additional entry forms are available online at [www.florencecountyfair.com](http://www.florencecountyfair.com).
3. Items should be made with a good clean wholesome nature—no vulgar or suggestive decorations will be allowed.
4. All exhibits shall remain on display for the duration of the fair.
5. Exhibit release is 4:00 p.m. Sunday. Removal of any or all exhibits before 4:00 p.m. Sunday will result in forfeiture of all premiums, as per Wisconsin State Regulations.
6. All exhibits at the fairgrounds are under the supervision of the Florence County Agricultural Society. Reasonable care will be taken to protect against loss, injury, or damage to exhibits; however, the exhibitor exhibits at his/her own risk.
7. Exhibits must be the work/craftsmanship of the exhibitor. Only exhibits not shown previously at the Florence County Fair may be entered this year. If an exhibit has won a premium at a different Wisconsin Fair, you will need to indicate that by the specific entry on your entry form.
8. Open Class Exhibits are judged under the Single Placing System.
9. State-registered judges are carefully selected: exhibitors agree to abide by the judges' decisions.
10. An exhibitor may enter only one item in each lot.
11. Violation of any Florence County Fair regulation shall result in forfeiture of premiums, and may result in being excluded from further competition.







- ◆ Must be free of insects and disease

- ◆ Premiums for field crops & potatoes:  
1<sup>st</sup>: \$2.00; 2<sup>nd</sup>: \$1.75; 3<sup>rd</sup>: \$1.50; 4<sup>th</sup>: \$1.25
- ◆ Premiums for Garden Crops (other than potatoes), herbs & fruit (other than apples):  
1<sup>st</sup>: \$1.75; 2<sup>nd</sup>: \$1.50; 3<sup>rd</sup>: \$1.25; 4<sup>th</sup>: \$1.00
- ◆ Premiums for Apples:

#### DEPARTMENT 115 — FLOWERS AND PLANTS

- ◆ All containers/pots/vases are brought at the owner's risk and should be identified with the owner's name on the bottom.
- ◆ All flowers entered must be grown by the exhibitor, except for wild-flowers
- ◆ Bouquets/Arrangements may not contain state protected, endangered species, noxious weeds or invasive species
- ◆ For any other variety categories, variety must be identified
- ◆ For houseplant, include index card with the type of houseplant listed on the card
- ◆ For preparing exhibits refer to Publication A2935 Evaluating and Judging Flowers and Indoor Plants found online at <https://learningstore.uwex.edu/Assets/pdfs/A2935.pdf>
- ◆ No artificial flowers allowed
- ◆ Plants must be clean and free of insects, disease or injury
- ◆ Potted plants should have appropriate drain dishes under the pot
- ◆ Premiums for flowers with 1-3 blooms or spikes:  
1st: \$1.75; 2nd: \$1.50; 3rd: \$1.25; 4th: \$1.00
- ◆ Premiums for flowers with 5 or more blooms or spikes:  
1st: \$2.50; 2nd: \$2.25; 3rd: \$2.00; 4th: \$1.50

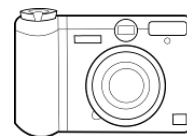

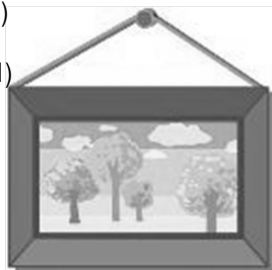

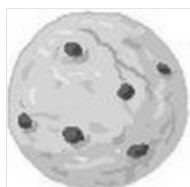

- ◆ All jars shall be labeled with: name of product, date reserved, method of preservation, type of pack (hot or cold) and processing time.
- ◆ All exhibits shall be in a standard clear jar, either pint or quart size, with a standard lid and screw band. Jellies and jams shall be entered in standard jelly glasses with self-sealing lid. NO paraffin!
- ◆ Low acid foods must be processed by pressure canner, example: low acid vegetables and meats. High acid foods may be processed by hot water bath process, example: fruits, pickles, tomatoes, and jams.
- ◆ Standard canning jars shall be used. Other food jars are not tempered to resist the heat of the canning process.

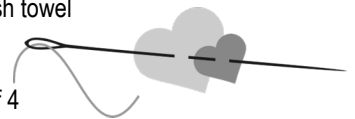
