- ♦ Registration is FREE.
- ♦ Registration Dates: If you have questions, you can call the fair at 906-282-9153 or email florencecountyfair@hotmail.com
  - ♦ Pre-Registration is until August 9.
  - ♦ Entries will be accepted after August 9, but it is requested that after August 9, you email your entries or bring your entry form with you to the fair on August 21. All items must be registered and brought to the fair by August 21.
- ♦ Please note: It is easier and quicker for you to preregister all of the items you think you might be bringing and then cancel those items that weren't ready when you drop off your items.
- ♦ Those pre-registered will have their entry tags printed and waiting for them when they come to drop off their exhibits.
- ◆ Pre-registered exhibitors may still add or remove items from their registration form when they bring their items to the fair.
- ♦ Please schedule a time to drop off your items on August 21. Due to current social distancing guidelines, only 2-3 exhibitors will be allowed in the building to drop off items at one time. You will need to sign-up for a drop-off time between noon and 6 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21. If you preregister, you can indicate your time preference on the form. If you do not preregister, you will need to call or e-mail to setup an appointment to drop off your items.

- ♦ Exhibits cannot be released before 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. Exhibits may be picked up between 4 and 6 p.m. on Sunday, August 25. You will be able to sign-up for a pick-up time when you drop off your exhibits. If this day and time does not work for picking up exhibits, please let us know when you bring your exhibits on Wednesday.
- ♦ There is a registration form on page 2. You may make copies or write on a blank sheet of paper. The same entry form can be used for kids (youth class), adults (open class) and special contest entries. Each individual must have their own form.

- Only one entry per exhibitor per category. The item must be the sole and original work of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor may
  enter one of each of the coloring contests. Only entries that have not been previously entered into these contests will be permitted.
- ♦ All Local Rules and Regulations apply to Special Contests unless specifically noted.

  - Children ages 5-6 may only enter exhibits listed in Department 17 Classes B through H.
  - Any child having completed first grade, through grade 12, may enter the rest of the exhibits Departments 1-16 and 18-34.
- 2. Additional entry forms are available online at www.florencecountyfair.com.
- 3. Items should be made with a good clean wholesome nature—no vulgar or suggestive decorations will be allowed.
- 4. All exhibits shall remain on display for the duration of the fair.
- 5. Exhibit release is 4:00 p.m. Sunday. Removal of any or all exhibits before 4:00 p.m. Sunday will result in forfeiture of all premiums, as per Wisconsin State Regulations.
- 6. All exhibits at the fairgrounds are under the supervision of the Florence County Agricultural Society. Reasonable care will be taken to protect against loss, injury, or damage to exhibits; however, the exhibitor exhibits at his/her own risk.



- ◆ Exhibitors will be classified as AMATEUR or PROFESSIONAL. A person who derives their main source of income from the sale of their photography or advertises to do photography commercially may not enter as an Amateur.
- For "Professional Photography Classes" please contact the fair office at 906-282-9153.
- ♦ Exhibits with more than one photo must have the pictures mounted together for one exhibit & for display purposes
- ♦ Only photos not previously entered in the Florence County Fair may be exhibited
- ◆ Photo print quality may affect the placing of the ribbon
- ◆ Photos may be black/white or color, except where specified
- ◆ Photos may only be entered once. The same photo cannot be used in a collection and an enlargement.
- Photos should not include, decorations, captions or titles when mounted—unless otherwise stated


